The Canada Coat By Louise Bergen Price

When her father's dreams to emigrate to Canada fall through, Rena and her family are trapped in Ukraine in the midst of the Holodomor, a famine that will kill millions. Then, just when it seems that the worst is over, her father goes missing, and Rena struggles to keep her hopes alive.

The author shares, "The Canada Coat is a fictionalized retelling of my mother's life as a young girl during the Holodomor, the famine that engulfed Ukraine in the early 1930s. The main characters - my grandparents, their children, the neighbours who helped them survive – are imagined versions of real people and are based on my mother's stories and her memoir." More historical notes are included in the book.

In The Canada Coat, Louise Bergen Price has woven a wealth of vivid images to evoke Stalinist Soviet Union through the eyes of Rena, a Mennonite girl—a chunk of mud-soaked bread just out of reach, the crashing thaw of the Dnieper River, a man on a rowboat ferry tapping tobacco onto a torn dictionary page—against a backdrop of hunger, beauty, and loss. Rena's feisty determination turns heartbreak into hope for her family, even under cruel hardship and Stalin's steely gaze. An absorbing novel in page after gripping page.
